Arts Training Fund Celebrates 12th Anniversary with Two New Training Centres for Children

Singapore 5 May 2017 – One of Singapore's well-known funds that supports arts training for financially disadvantaged children, The Business Times Budding Artists Fund (BT BAF), celebrates its 12th year this May by expanding its reach to the northern part of Singapore

Founded in 2005 with the aim of providing a level-playing field in the arts for young people from financially disadvantaged families, BT BAF which is managed by The RICE Company Ltd (TRCL) will be opening two new arts training centres for children in Northpoint in Yishun come fourth quarter of this year.

At present, BT BAF already supports two centrally located arts centres, The Little Arts Academy (LAA) located at Selegie Road and 10 Square @ Orchard Central (10 Square) on Orchard Road. LAA and 10 Square are multi-disciplinary arts centres which provide creative learning environments for children and youth respectively. Beneficiaries of the BT BAF aged 6 to 19 pursue music, dance, theatre and visual arts at these two centres.

Explains Alvin Tay, Chairman of BT BAF on the decision to develop two more new centres in northern area of Singapore: "There are many who may find it challenging to travel to town for their lessons. As such, these two new centres will serve the needs of families in the North and North East and make it more convenient for them to attend arts classes. With the two new campuses, The Little Arts Academy will also be able to increase its annual intake by 300 and further its reach so as to sustain a running cohort of 800 beneficiaries."

The two new centres will be called Little Arts Academy North Campus 1 and North Campus 2.

Elaborates Ms Aminah Hussien, head of both LAA and 10 Square: "Since 2005, the BT BAF has supported more than 15,000 children and youths from all walks of life. We hope to keep up with this momentum and to further deepen our outreach efforts into the heartlands of Singapore with the opening of the Little Arts Academy North 1 and 2."

Launched on 12 May 2005, BT BAF, will celebrate its anniversary this Friday, 5 May, with a performance by the students and alumni from LAA and 10 Square. Titled "A Special TSA: Truth, Struggles & Achievement", the stories of the main cast will be narrated through a series of videos and performances that depict their perspective towards life, education as well as their learning journey through the arts.

The celebrations at 10 Square will also acknowledge a donation of S\$400,000 by UOB to BT BAF through ChildAid. ChildAid is an annual children's charity concert which raises funds for BT BAF and The Straits Times School Pocket Money Fund.

To mark this, Mr Eric Tham, head of group commercial banking at UOB, will present a cheque to Mr Alvin Tay, Chairman of BT BAF.

Says Mr Tham "UOB's support of art education is one way we give back to the community as we believe that the arts can inspire hearts and minds. We are pleased to be part of The Business Times Budding Artists Fund's 12th anniversary celebrations and to continue our contribution to the fund as we are inspired by the passion shown by these young performers and their ability to create performances that enrich the minds and inspire the community."
