Marina Bay to glow with over 150 specially-designed ChariTrees

- ChariTrees partners stakeholders of the upcoming Marina Bay pilot Business Improvement District to expand its annual event beyond the Marina Bay waterfront promenade to four other locations in the Marina Bay precinct
- President of Singapore, Madam Halimah Yacob will officiate the light-up of ChariTrees on 15 November 2019
- 10 community heroes will be honoured and 500 beneficiaries' wishes to be granted
- Debut of Augmented Reality Trees, Luminous Trees, and Wishing Trees will be added to this year's edition of ChariTrees to enhance visitor experience
- ChariTrees fundraises for The Business Times Budding Artists Fund

SINGAPORE, 7 October 2019 – Christmas revelers can participate in lively festivities at Marina Bay as the precinct comes aglow with ChariTrees. Over 150 specially-designed physical and digital Christmas trees will be displayed at the Marina Bay waterfront promenade for six weeks from 15 November to 26 December

2019. President of the Republic of Singapore, Madam Halimah Yacob will officiate the ChariTrees light-up on 15 November 2019 as Guest of Honour.

The ChariTrees initiative is a fundraising movement which was launched by the Community Chest in 2011. Since 2018, ChariTrees has been organised by not-for-profit arts and culture organisation, The RICE Company Ltd, to honour Singapore's community heroes and raise funds for The Business Times Budding Artists Fund (BT BAF).

This year's ChariTrees will gain greater visibility through a partnership with the Marina Bay Alliance, represented by the stakeholders of the upcoming Marina Bay pilot Business Improvement District (BID) and the Marina Bay pilot BID Manager, Keppel Land. The partnership will see the display extend beyond its usual area along the Marina Bay waterfront promenade to an additional four locations within the precinct owned by stakeholders of the Marina Bay Alliance, namely, Marina Bay Financial Centre, Marina One, OUE Bayfront and The Fullerton Heritage.

Mr Tan Puay Kern, Chairman of the ChariTrees 2019 Organising Committee, said, "We are grateful to the Marina Bay pilot BID stakeholders for partnering us to honour community heroes and encourage the spirit of giving. This year's ChariTrees will see the movement take on new initiatives to make itself more relevant and reach out to more people. It will leverage digital technology to enhance visitors' experience and reach out to more beneficiaries."

Highlights of ChariTrees 2019:

- 1. The Marina Bay pilot BID stakeholders will launch a "Grant-A-Wish" programme in partnership with ChariTrees to fulfil the wishes of beneficiaries from several charities. With the aim of increasing engagement with a wider community, the stakeholders will display *Wishing Trees* at their properties located within Marina Bay and invite tenants, residents and the public to grant those wishes.
- 2. All five ChariTrees locations will have augmented reality (AR) ChariTrees to provide an immersive experience for visitors. Each *AR Tree* will feature a different theme associated with Christmas, such as stars, doves and angels.
- 3. New *Luminous Trees*, symbolising shining beacons of love, kindness and generosity, will be featured alongside last year's installation of *Art* and *Traditional Trees* at the Marina Bay waterfront promenade.

Mr Sim Puay Kiak, Chairman-Designate of the Marina Bay Alliance, said, "We are delighted to be a part of the ChariTrees programme as it provides a meaningful platform to strengthen the community spirit among the communities of Marina Bay while enlivening the precinct. ChariTrees 2019 marks the commencement of a series of precinct-level events and regular activities under the Marina Bay pilot Business Improvement District programme to engage communities."

He added, "Working closely with the government agencies, our stakeholders and Keppel Land, the Marina Bay pilot BID Manager, we aim to enhance the Marina Bay precinct as a vibrant and exciting work-live-play destination, as well as raise the value and profile of Marina Bay as a business and lifestyle hub. ChariTrees is the Alliance's first collective effort to give back to the community. By bringing the *Wishing*

Trees to our properties' doorstep, we make it more accessible and convenient for our tenants and the public to get involved in charitable causes. We encourage everyone to do good and support this initiative."

The ChariTrees along the Marina Bay waterfront promenade will celebrate and share the stories of ten individuals and groups whose contributions have improved and empowered various segments of Singapore's society. Their extraordinary humanity and compassion towards the community will serve as inspiration to many.

Mr Alvin Tay, Deputy Chairman of The RICE Company Ltd that manages BT BAF, noted, "Through ChariTrees, we hope to encourage more people to do something good for others. No act of kindness is ever too small to make a difference. We are thankful to our donors and partners for their strong support to enable our children and youth to pursue their passion in the arts."

The Marina Bay Alliance is the Presenter of ChariTrees 2019. Diamond donors include Raffles Quay Asset Management Pte Ltd, M+S Pte Ltd, Sino Land Company Pte. Each ChariTrees can be adopted from \$10,000 and all donations are entitled to 250% tax deduction.
